The family attends Keisa & Cristiano's church and their 5 children are active in many church activities. They are in the middle of the jungle off a dirt road with more holes than flat ground. A picturesque location, but not a friendly place when you have nothing. Dona Julia is striving to make changes in her life and we see that she is someone who could benefit and appreciate any thing we can do for them.
